# 2025 Facts & Challenges

During 2025, KYCLOS was widely recognized for its teaching program and approach. The number of students in the Greek language classes doubled. Both because our students have been spreading their learning experience, so new refugees apply to learn and also because more referrals from shelters of unaccompanied children, other NGOs, and public schools are coming. That is why, this year, KYCLOS made a switch and placed a stronger focus on two of its core activities:

- 1) Teaching program
- 2) Empowerment sessions

Every month of 2025, KYCLOS has been welcoming around 60 new registrations. On average, 200 people receive services every day. Approximately 150 of them, remain in KYCLOS and keep on studying and around 50 leave after a while. In this way, we are able to welcome new applicants.

Thus, unlike in many other organizations where beneficiaries stay only for a short period, refugees at KYCLOS remain actively involved for much longer — often over 1.5 years — continuing their language learning and participation in activities. This is happening because they think of KYCLOS as a place where they belong.

Accordingly, KYCLOS has become a community where people grow in, from and through it. This is the added value of our organization, but at the same time this is the challenge that we face. It takes a lot of time for a refugee to get integrated, so beneficiaries have to stay in KYCLOS, but at the same time, serving new has been a challenge.

# Why focusing more on education and on empowerment

In 2025, we experienced that job industry had grown and more workers are needed in the primary sector. Thus the majority of the refugees who reached KYCLOS already were settled job wise, but without speaking any Greek. That is why, focusing more on providing education was much more demanding.


At the same time, in KYCLOS we believe that to get integrate along with job and the language, people have to belong somewhere and feel that they are not alone and unsupported. That is why we focused even more in empowerment sessions and activities this year. Through them, our beneficiaries find the very first group to belong to, in which they build strings and gradually are able to get independent while having a strong network.

# 1) Teaching program

Two dedicated teachers and four facilitator refugees currently deliver Greek lessons within KYCLOS, with help from other KYCLOS' members. Because most beneficiaries work in the mornings, all classes are scheduled in the afternoon. Our students are divided into three main groups based on how they engage with the learning process:

- Those who attend for the **first three months**, focusing on building the basic structure of the Greek language, often without yet being able to communicate effectively.
- Those who stay for **three to 1.5 years**, learning to communicate in everyday Greek and to write with confidence.
- Those who continue for **1.5 to 4 years**, aiming to obtain an official language certification (A1, A2, or B1 level) or to prepare for the Greek citizenship exams.

Learning the language remains central to our integration process — enabling refugees to find employment, communicate confidently, and participate fully in social life.



# 1) Teaching program

## Greek Language Certification exams

It takes a lot of time to build a new life in a foreign country. Learning Greek is very difficult too. We are very proud for our students who do not give up and keep on trying. This year, four of them successfully passed the official Greek Language Certification exams, a remarkable achievement that reflects their perseverance and dedication. Such long-term engagement is rare, and it fills us with pride, as it demonstrates not only the systematic and consistent work carried out by our team but also the trust, encouragement, and sense of belonging that define the KYCLOS' learning environment.



## 2) Empowerment sessions

In 2025, in collaboration with AKMA ("Athenian Institute of Anthropolis"), KYCLOS launched empowerment groups, bringing together participants of the same origin, age or gender. Refugees arrive carrying visible or invisible burdens- loss, insecurity, loneliness and fear. Empowerment groups go along with learning Greek because they consist the very first network where beneficiaries feel they belong. Empowerment sessions provide a safe space where people can share experiences, express themselves, create new networks, get supported and rebuild confidence. Through meeting, discussing, eating, dancing and drawing together a network of support is created for everyone, that can guarantee and assist in having a stable new life.






# Financial & Operational review




# For the upcoming year
